



What to Expect...

For a Sunday Morning Gathering At the Corner Church

We are glad you are planning to attend our Sunday morning service at the Corner Church at 10:30 am. In order to give you peace of mind about the safety of this event, and to help you know what to expect when you attend, here is a detailed list of the procedures we will be following at this event.

1. The purpose of this gathering is for a Live Worship Service.
2. Services will continue to be live streamed for those who can not attend the live service and attendees will be asked to adhere to live-stream etiquette.
3. Anyone entering the building must complete the sign-up form and Health questionnaire that is provided on the Church website. Everyone is asked to RSVP if they are attending in person.
4. Mask wearing will be required in keeping with Durham Region Public Health guidelines. The Pastor, Speakers and Worship Team will wear a mask, except when speaking and singing from the stage.
5. Proof of Vaccination will be required upon entering the building.
6. Two ushers will be scheduled to manage the doors. Each will have a spray bottle of *First Defense Surface Disinfectant*. They will open doors for people as they arrive. Hand sanitizer will be provided at the top of the stairs and each person will be requested to sanitize their hands upon entering the sanctuary (People who are allergic can wash hands with soap and water in the bathroom). Ushers will sanitize all the front entryway touch points once the service begins.
7. If someone arrives who has not RSVP'd ahead of time, they will be required to answer the Health Questionnaire upon arrival.
8. Children's Ministry will not be offered at this stage.
9. Both downstairs bathrooms will remain closed. The single, main floor bathroom will be open for general use.
10. No "passing of the plate" collection will occur. The church will be encouraged to continue using online means of tithing. A touch-free drop-box will be provided for those who bring an offering on site.
11. Communion will be served using per-packaged communion cups. On a communion Sunday, these will be set out at the entrance of the sanctuary and attendees will be

asked to take one as they enter. People will be asked to dispose of their own communion cups after use.

12. No beverages or snacks will be allowed, and no after-service fellowship time will occur in the building.
13. After the service, the attendance record will be filed in the Pastors locked desk cabinet, to be used to contact all those who attended the services if an attendee later tests positive for COVID-19. If we are notified that someone who attended one of our services has tested positive, we will immediately contact Durham Public Health for direction. In such a case, we will notify anyone who attended any service that this person also attended, going back 14 days. Attendance records will be kept for 30 days.
14. When weather permits, one or more windows will be opened to increase ventilation. The church's current air purifiers will be used in the sanctuary.
